About Young Adults in Global Mission

The ELCA's Young Adults in Global Mission program provides young adults, ages 21-35, the opportunity to grow in their faith and work in partnership with our global companions. Young adults in the program serve in churches, schools and social service ministries. Currently the program is engaged in work in Argentina and Uruguay, Cambodia, Central Europe (Hungry and Serbia), Mexico, Senegal, and the United Kingdom.

The total cost for one young adult in the program is \$18,000. Each young adult is tasked with raising a minimum of \$6,000 to help support their year of service. The ELCA commits to raising the additional \$12,000 per volunteer through generous congregations and individual donors. If more than \$6,000 in gifts is received, the additional funds will help support other

young adult volunteers and the future of the Young Adults in Global Mission program.

Second Helpings is a major player in Nutrition Assistance in the Central Indiana area. Founded a little more than 25 years ago, it helps the area's nutritionally disadvantaged through three areas of involvement: -Food rescue on a massive scale.

-Hunger Relief Kitchen. Daily, using the donated food, Second Helpings prepares approximately 5,000 meals that are delivered to more than 100 agencies in the Indianapolis area.

-Culinary Training. Second Helpings continually offers culinary training classes for unemployed and underemployed persons seeking a career in the food service industry. Since it's inception, more than 1,000 persons have been trained.

My neighborhood learned something strange when Covid struck in 2020.

Liturgical Shields

In 1945, Pastor Don Elder created two shields decorated with liturgical symbols--one for the Epiphany of Our Lord, and one for Reformation Sunday. He organized an Ecclesiastical Arts Group in 1949 and proposed decorating the entire ceiling of the sanctuary with similar shields to represent every Sunday, Principal Festival, and Lesser Festival celebrated in the church year at that time. Pastor Elder designed two series of shields (essentially the church year twice), 130 shields in total, and the EAG painted them, completing the project in 1952. The shields don't always correspond to particular lectionary readings of the day, but they do draw on the themes for the seasons and incorporate symbols related to them. Each series runs from the top row to the bottom, from the front of the nave to the back.

These shields correspond to the Sundays and festival days of August this year in the South series:

18 August 2024: Time after Pentecost (Lectionary 20) — "Ordination", green The stole symbolizes the rite of ordination. A long narrow piece of cloth worn over around the neck for pastors and bishops, and over the left shoulder for deacons, it represents the yoke of Christ.

25 August 2024: Time after Pentecost (Lectionary 21) — "The Mystic Star", green

A star of seven points with a letter within each symbolizes the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit: Blessing, Glory, Wisdom, Thanksgiving, Honor, Power, and Might.

Festivals for which there are no shields: 15 August 2024: Mary, Mother of Our Lord 24 August 2024: Bartholomew, Apostle
