General Operating Net Income Update and Appeal

As of November 30, 2024, net income for Bethlehem's general operating fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024 and ending June 30, 2025 was (\$35,742), which is a negative figure. Actual receipts for the period were \$127,844 as compared to budgeted receipts of \$169,278. Actual expenses for the fiscal year were \$163,586 as compared to budgeted expenses of \$169,278. The main driver of the negative net income figure was smaller giving totals of \$17,270 in October and \$12,013 in November. We need pledges and offerings of \$33,206 per month to be on budget. This amounts to \$7,663 per week.

Please check your funds available and consider additional giving. Regular giving is most helpful for meeting monthly expenses, and this can be automated via VANCO or your bank's bill paying service.

Saint Lucia of Syracuse, d. 304, martyr


On Sunday, we commemorate a saint particularly beloved in Scandinavian countries, Saint Lucia.

Lucia (or Lucy) was born in Syracuse, Sicilia (Sicily), around 283 CE. At a young age she chose to remain unmarried and dedicated herself to God at a time when Roman authorities persecuted Christians. Her mother, however, fearing for health and Lucy's future, tried to arrange a marriage for her daughter, which Lucy rejected. The man who was supposed to marry her retaliated by turning Lucy in to the governor of Sicilia as a Christian. When she refused to renounce her faith and offer a sacrifice to the Emperor, she was executed in 304 CE at the age of 21.

One popular legend says she used to sneak food to other Christians hiding in the Roman catacombs. In order to bring as much food as she could in her arms, she put candles in a wreath on her head to light her way through the catacombs, and this is how she is usually portrayed in processions and celebrations.

Though she is a Sicilian saint, her association with light (her name means "light"), feast day of 13 December (near the darkest night of the year, the Winter Solstice), and a resemblance in-name-only to, and subversion of, an ancient (evil) Scandinavian figure "Lussi", who flew through the sky on the darkest night of the year, made her an extremely popular saint in Scandinavian religion and culture, which is where the well-known Saint Lucy traditions come from.

This year, Antonio Ladrón de Guevara will be hosting the Bethlehem festivities. Antonio is a junior at North Central High School, and is proud to don the robes of St. Lucius. He is a member of the NC's Counterpoints showchoir and Repertory Theater, and participates in track and field. In his scarce spare time, he loves playing guitar and playing soccer.
