Who Are the Saints?

There's a photo card of my grandmother, Joan Pearson, on my home altar. She died four years ago this month. The date she died is on my personal calendar. I think about her often, but I try to take a little extra time on that day to think about everything she did for me growing up and as an adult. She lived around the block from us, she sang in the church choir and taught Sunday School, she was one of the few people our dogs would let in the yard, she was the matriarch of our family. The stories I could tell about her would fill a small book.

It wasn't always my practice to pause and remember those I knew who have died. I started it last year when I looked back and realized I'd lost someone significant in my life every year from 2018-2022. My whole family dynamic shifted radically over those five years. Stories we used to tell with people were now told about them. An entire generation was now gone on one side. It was up to us to keep their stories alive.

For thousands of years the church has been the sacred keeper of the stories of those who have gone before us. The earliest stories were passed down over roughly eighty generations, but new stories are added every day across the world as faithful Christians die and entrust their stories to those who come after them.

This is why we celebrate All Saints Sunday every year, to remember those who have died in the faith and now wait for the resurrection of the dead. These -are- the saints: not just the famous Christians depicted in icons and named in liturgies, but ordinary, everyday people we knew ourselves. We may be the only ones who know their stories, but they are saints, and this Sunday we pause to remember, to reflect, and to celebrate their lives and the difference they made in ours.

Liturgical Shields

In 1945, Pastor Don Elder created two shields decorated with liturgical symbols--one for the Epiphany of Our Lord, and one for Reformation Sunday. He organized an Ecclesiastical Arts Group in 1949 and proposed decorating the entire ceiling of the sanctuary with similar shields to represent every Sunday, Principal Festival, and Lesser Festival celebrated in the church year at that time. Pastor Elder designed two series of shields (essentially the church year twice), 130 shields in total, and the EAG painted them, completing the project in 1952.

The shields don't always correspond to particular lectionary readings of the day, but they do draw on the themes for the seasons and incorporate symbols related to them. Each series runs from the top row to the bottom, from the front of the nave to the back.

These shields correspond to the Sundays and festival days of October this year in the South series:

31 October 2024: Reformation Day — "The Luther Rose", red Luther's personal seal has become the symbol of the Lutheran Church. A cross centered in a red heart surrounded by golden rays symbolizes the glory of Christ and faith in him. A white rose surrounds the heart and is a symbol of purity, peace, and joy. A blue field surrounds the golden ring of eternity to complete the seal.

1 November 2024: All Saints Day — "Manus Dei", white
The hand of God extending from the heavens is the traditional symbol of
All Saints' Day. The hand of God concept is based on scriptural passages
such as Psalm 98:1, "His right hand... hath given Him victory." It expresses
the idea of the hand of God over the souls of the righteous.

3 November 2024: Time after Pentecost (Lectionary 31) — "The Love of Christ", green

2 Corinthians 5:14 is the source for this shield symbolizing the Trinity--a circle (God, eternity) surrounds a cross (Christ) with a descending dove (Holy Spirit) carrying the olive branch of peace.

10 November 2024: Time after Pentecost (Lectionary 32) — "Ecumene", green

A cross on the ship of the church represents the World Council of Churches and its work for the common good of the faith in the turbulent world.

17 November 2024: Time after Pentecost (Lectionary 33) — (There are a few missing shields here.)

24 November 2024: Christ the King (Last Sunday after Pentecost-Lectionary 34) — "Judgment", white

The sword of righteousness and a pair of balances used to weigh the souls of humanity are ancient symbols of the Last Judgment.

30 November 2024: Andrew, Apostle — "St. Andrew", red The cross saltire, with arms of equal length extending to the edges of the shield is a common symbol of St. Andrew. Legend says he died on a cross of that configuration. The boat hook is a reference to his travels in spreading the gospel.
