Service Project: Looking forward to our fall service projects, please save the dates for the following events:

- October 6: October's service project will be focused on engaging our surrounding neighbors and improving the local environment. We'll meet in the church parking lot on Sunday, October 6 at 9a and clean the storm drains on neighborhood streets. Cleaning storm drains and gutters ensures rainwater can make its way to the inlets preventing flooding on local streets and at curb ramps. Removing sediment from these areas also helps keep pollutants like oil, fluids from cars, and brake dust that attach to sediment out of our waterways. Please bring flat head shovels, snow shovels (to be used as big dust pans), brooms (regular or push), gloves, and boxes of heavy duty trash bags and wear "yard work" clothes you don't mind getting dirty in. The more hands, the merrier! For those of you who were not able to participate in this event last year, it was a lot of fun and we hope you can join us. We're also looking for 2-4 wheelbarrows. Liturgical Shields

In 1945, Pastor Don Elder created two shields decorated with liturgical symbols--one for the Epiphany of Our Lord, and one for Reformation Sunday. He organized an Ecclesiastical Arts Group in 1949 and proposed decorating the entire ceiling of the sanctuary with similar shields to represent every Sunday, Principal Festival, and Lesser Festival celebrated in the church year at that time. Pastor Elder designed two series of shields (essentially the church year twice), 130 shields in total, and the EAG painted

them, completing the project in 1952.

The shields don't always correspond to particular lectionary readings of the day, but they do draw on the themes for the seasons and incorporate symbols related to them. Each series runs from the top row to the bottom, from the front of the nave to the back.

These shields correspond to the Sundays and festival days of September & October this year in the South series:

29 September 2024: Time after Pentecost (Lectionary 26) — "Chi Rho", green

The Chi Rho is among the most ancient of Christian symbols. It is an abbreviation of the Greek word for Christ, "XP" (in Greek, the letter "X" makes the "chi" sound and the letter "P" is our letter "R").

6 October 2024: Time after Pentecost (Lectionary 27) — "Cross Crenelle", green

Also known as the "Embattled Cross", this cross's edges suggest battlements. This is the symbol of the church militant.

13 October 2024: Time after Pentecost (Lectionary 28) — "Cross Flament", green

This cross with flame-like edges is a symbol of religious zeal.

18 October 2024: Luke, Evangelist — "St. Luke", red A winged ox serves as the symbol of St. Luke because of his detailed account of Christ's sacrificial death in his gospel.

20 October 2024: Time after Pentecost (Lectionary 29) — "Cross Fitchee", green

Any cross with its lower arm drawn out to a point is "fitched". This form originated during the Crusades when the Crusaders carried small crosses with pointed ends to be thrust into the ground for daily devotions.

27 October 2024: Time after Pentecost (Lectionary 30) — "Cross of the Four Pheons", green

This heraldic cross is composed of four dart heads, points touching. The inner edges of the dart heads are serrated. It is said this cross reminds one

of the fiery darts of the wicked and resistance through the power of the cross of Christ.

28 October 2024: Simon and Jude, Apostles — "St. Simon", red The fish and book symbol of Simon refer to his great missionary work as a fisher of people through the gospel.

31 October 2024: Reformation Day — "The Luther Rose", red Luther's personal seal has become the symbol of the Lutheran Church. A cross centered in a red heart surrounded by golden rays symbolizes the glory of Christ and faith in him. A white rose surrounds the heart and is a symbol of purity, peace, and joy. A blue field surrounds the golden ring of eternity to complete the seal.

Festivals for which there are no shields: 29 September 2024: Michael and All Angels
