**Scam Alert from Pastor Ken:** You may have received suspicious emails or text messages claiming to be from Pastor Ken asking for your help with a private matter, usually asking to buy gift cards for someone.

This is a VERY common scam. If you receive any message from me that looks suspicious, please keep the following in mind:

- My ONLY cell phone number for begins with a 715 (Wisconsin) area code. If you receive a text message from any other number, it is NOT me.
- I send emails from one of two email addresses. Bulk messages sent to the entire congregation come from "pastor@indylutheran.org" and are send through the ICON Database system the congregation uses.

All other messages are sent from my personal email account "ken@ecumenicallife.com". Emails sent from this account are always digitally signed with a public cryptographic key. It will either be included as part of the message itself or sent as an attachment. You can use a program like GnuPG or Enigmail to verify the validity of the public key, proving that I really did send the email.

If you receive an email from any other address, even it comes through from "Pastor Ken Ranos", it is NOT from me.

- Lastly, if you are ever suspicious of a text or email, contact me directly a different way--don't reply to the text or suspicious email itself.

## **Liturgical Shields**

In 1945, Pastor Don Elder created two shields decorated with liturgical symbols--one for the Epiphany of Our Lord, and one for Reformation Sunday. He organized an Ecclesiastical Arts Group in 1949 and proposed decorating the entire ceiling of the sanctuary with similar shields to represent every Sunday, Principal Festival, and Lesser Festival celebrated in the church year at that time. Pastor Elder designed two series of shields (essentially the church year twice), 130 shields in total, and the EAG painted them, completing the project in 1952.

The shields don't always correspond to particular lectionary readings of the day, but they do draw on the themes for the seasons and incorporate symbols related to them. Each series runs from the top row to the bottom, from the front of the nave to the back.

These shields correspond to the Sundays and festival days of June & July this year in the South series:

29 June 2024: Peter and Paul, Apostles — "Spiritus Gladius", red

An open Bible bearing the words "Spiritus Gladius" with a cross-hilted sword behind is the most common symbol of the apostle Paul. The Bible

represents the word of God and the sword that of the Spirit.

Two keys saltire refer to Peter's confession and Christ's response that Peter held the keys to the kingdom (Matthew 16:13-19). Together, with an inverted Latin cross (referring to Peter's mode of execution in Rome), the serve as the shield of Peter.

30 June 2024: Time after Pentecost (Lectionary 13) — "The Church", green

A ship with a cross-shaped mast, sailing through troubled waters, recalls the storm-tossed ship on the Sea of Galilee and represents the Church tossed by the waves of persecution, heresy, and false teachers.

3 July 2024: Thomas, Apostle — "St. Thomas the Apostle", green (red)

The carpenter's square in this apostle's shield refers to Thomas's calling as a builder of churches. He is said to have preached the gospel in India until his death from a spear wound, hence the spear in his shield.

\*This shield is on the north ceiling.\*

7 July 2024: Time after Pentecost (Lectionary 14) — "Wheat and Tares", green

This recalls that both believers and hypocrites dwell in the church and shall be separated at the Last Judgment, as described in the parable in Matthew 8:24-30.

14 July 2024: Time after Pentecost (Lectionary 15) — "Holy Baptism", green

The universal symbol for the sacrament of Holy Baptism is the font. This octagonal shape symbolizes regeneration while the font cover is surmounted by a cross representing redemption.

21 July 2024: Time after Pentecost (Lectionary 16) — "St. Jude the Apostle", red (green)

A carpenter by trade, Jude's missionary vision took him on extensive travels with Simon. Thus, Jude's shield is a boat hook and a carpenter's square.

25 July 2024: James, Apostle; and 28 July 2024: Time after

Pentecost (Lectionary 17) — St. James the Greater", red (green)

The scallop shell does not refer to St. James or any event in his life, but symbolizes him because the scallop shell was the badge of pilgrims to his shrine at Compostella, Spain. The scallop shell eventually became the badge of any Christian pilgrim.

Liturgical festivals for which there are no shields:

31 May 2024: Visit of Mary to Elizabeth 22 July 2024: Mary Magdalene, Apostle
